



A REPORT ON FIELD VISIT

Village 1: Turi Khurd

The village is situated nearby IIM Bodh Gaya and has a population of approx 500 people. The village has one primary school and an Anganwadi for the basic education of the children. As per the records of Anganwadi, they have 40 students admitted. The village was immaculate but had some prevalent issues. The absence of a water tank in the village leads to storage problems. Private schools are costly, and government schools are far from home; girls don't go for schooling because of this. Proper drainage is missing, and also Bathrooms are missing in many houses.

Recommendations: Coaching to class 9th and 10th can be arranged. The water tank can be gifted to the village. We can start a weekly session with the students to teach them basic communicational English.

Village 2: Turi Bujurg

This village had a population of approx 800 people. The village has one school for primary education of the children, which operated till class 8th. As per the records of the school, they have 58 students admitted. There were few issues observed during the visit. The connectivity to school is very bad, and it was not easy to reach the school. The situation would degrade in the rainy season because of lack of proper roads. Proper drainage was missing in the village, and the bathrooms were also missing.

Recommendations: Student mentorship can be started for the students, and also same can be used to motivate them for studies. We can start a cleanliness drive within the village to motivate them to keep the place clean.

Village 3: Rampur

The village is situated at the back of our permanent campus and has an approximately 2000 people population. The village has one school till class 8th and an Anganwadi for the basic education of the children. As per the records of the school, they have 108 students admitted. There were few issues observed during the visit. The land allocated by the government has not been received since 2004. There is a lack of training Staff. Proper drainage is missing in the village.

Recommendations: Student mentorship can be started for the students, and also same can be used to motivate them for studies. Interactive sessions can be kept to encourage the students to come to school.

Village 4: Bapunagar

This village had a population of approx 2100 people. The village has Anganwadi for the primary education of the children. As per the records of the school, they have 40 students admitted. There were few issues observed during the visit. There are many private schools in the locality, and poor people can't afford good schools. School can be shifted to another location from Mudhouse, and connectivity to school is bad, especially in the rainy season.



Recommendations: We can start a weekly session with the students to teach them basic communicational English.

Village 5: Mohdar

This village had a population of approx 1050 people. The village has one school for the primary education of the children, which operated till class 8th. As per the school records, they have 150 students admitted, out of which 95 are girls. There were few issues observed during the visit. The majority of students go to private school—improper Drainage and Bathrooms.

Recommendations: Fun activities with Students can be planned with the students. We can repair the water pump around the school. As more than 50% of students are girls, we can initiate a happy period programme here
