

It is reiterated many a times that India has to build its lower and middle class if it has to transform into a developed country. Over 73% of wealth generated is cornered with richest 1% of population. In order to have an equitable distribution of resources, we must ensure that we have higher standards of living. In the last union budget before the general election due next year, the Government had taken various steps towards this goal and attempted to open the umbrella for these classes of our economy which constitutes a large share of our voting population. This year's budget doesn't talk about schemes & reforms which speak loud, but the concentrated efforts focus on major changes in agriculture, rural development, health, education, employment, MSME and infrastructure sector.

With the aim to maintain strong fiscal position at the target deficit of 3.3 against 3.5 last year, the Government has given impetus to structural sector reforms for achieving higher growth rates. This has been the hot topic of discussion amongst economists and experts whether the government is more concerned about its fiscal position than growth or not, as many countries in the past have strengthened their economy by spending more on borrowings.

Minimum support price has been increased to 1.5 times the production cost for all major rabi and kharif crops. Higher targets have been set for Ujjwala, Saubhagya and Swachh Mission to cater to lower and middle class in providing free LPG connections, Electricity and toilets. Outlay on health, education and social protection is set at 1.38 lakh crore.

The Government has launched the world's largest health protection scheme covering over 10 crore poor and vulnerable families with a family limit upto 5 lakh rupees for secondary and tertiary treatment. This is a big leap towards Universal health coverage. Although Infrastructure has again been given a sizeable chunk of money with the allocation of 5.9 lakh crore, yet no major reforms were announced this year except a few which the corporate world was expecting. These were the major points underlined in the budget.

Overall, this year's budget has been termed as mediocre by experts as they were expecting the last budget before election to be centred towards lower and middle class, and also some concrete steps taken to strengthen the manufacturing and service sector in India.
