Management Development Programme for the Officers of Department of Agriculture, Government of Bihar (BAMETI) – Batch II

Programme Brief: The "Management and Skill Development Programme (MDP)" was conducted for the officers of the Department of Agriculture, Government of Bihar, with a focus on developing



strategic thinking, team building, financial acumen, and other general management skills under a training partnership between the Bihar Agriculture Management and Extension Training Institute (BAMETI) and the Indian Institute of Management Bodh Gaya (IIMBG). The MDP was designed through the vision of the esteemed director, Prof. Vinita S. Sahay, who

has unwavering faith in the current generation's capacity to push progress in Bihar. The programme was scheduled from September 17-22, 2024, and had 27 participants from 15 districts of Bihar. Faculty coordinators, Professors Payal Dey and Anirban Sengupta spearheaded the MDP along with the Chairperson, officials, and staff of Executive Education and Consultancy committee of IIMBG. This training programme's success is evidence of IIMBG's persistent commitment to responding to the evolving demands of business, society, and the country with creative and workable solutions.
